## Proclamation

WHEREAS: Computer science is embedded in modern life and foundational to nearly every sector of the U.S.

economy, contributing to innovation, workforce development, and economic growth; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota was an early leader in the development of computers, devices, networks, and

educational computing; and

WHEREAS: Access to computer science education, including qualified teachers, technology, and age-

appropriate curriculum, promotes critical thinking skills and creativity; and

WHEREAS: Significant equity barriers remain in computer science, including racial and gender disparities and

unequal access to resources, instruction, and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS: Through the K-12 Computer Science Education Advancement Act and state grants, Minnesota is

working to address these disparities and advance equitable computer science education for all

students; and

WHEREAS: Artificial intelligence (AI) literacy helps students move from passive users of technology to

informed, thoughtful participants, building understanding, curiosity, and confidence in emerging

technologies; and

WHEREAS: Leadership in computer science and AI support innovation, economic strength, community well-

being, and future workforce needs; and

WHEREAS: Computer Science Education Week highlights the importance of expanding access to computer

science and AI education for learners across Minnesota.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim December 8-12, 2025, as:
